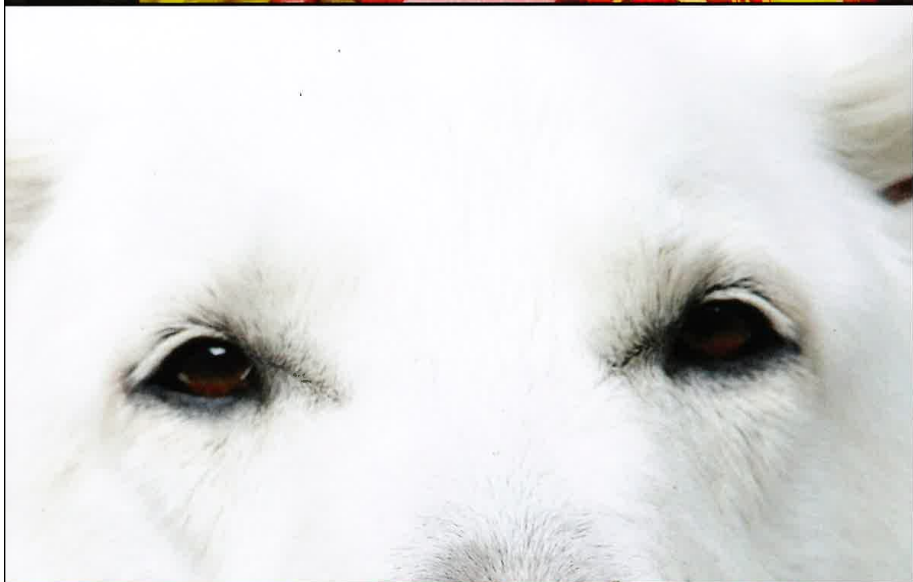
Personal Counselling Support (one to one)
