Join us at coffee hour next week and introduce yourselves to Emmanuel College professors, Michelle Voss Roberts and HyeRan Kim-Cragg.

Michelle Voss Roberts is the 13th principal of Emmanuel College and the first woman to lead the institution as Principal in its 90-year history.

An expert in comparative theology, with a particular focus on Christian and Hindu contexts, Voss Roberts has also written widely about aesthetics, gender, and embodiment. Her teaching integrates the study of Christian theological traditions with theories of gender and sexuality, disability studies, and religious pluralism.

HyeRan Kim-Cragg holds the Timothy Eaton Memorial Professorship in Preaching at Emmanuel College. She is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea and has served in pastoral, teaching, and intercultural leadership capacities with the United Church of Canada for the past twenty years.

Committed to an interdisciplinary approach to homiletics in practical theology, her teaching and research address a range of topics related to biblical interpretation, postcolonial theories, feminist homiletics and liturgy, migration, and decolonizing practices. Her current interests are in the intercultural preaching, as this intersects with race, gender, and multiple identities of the preacher and the congregations.

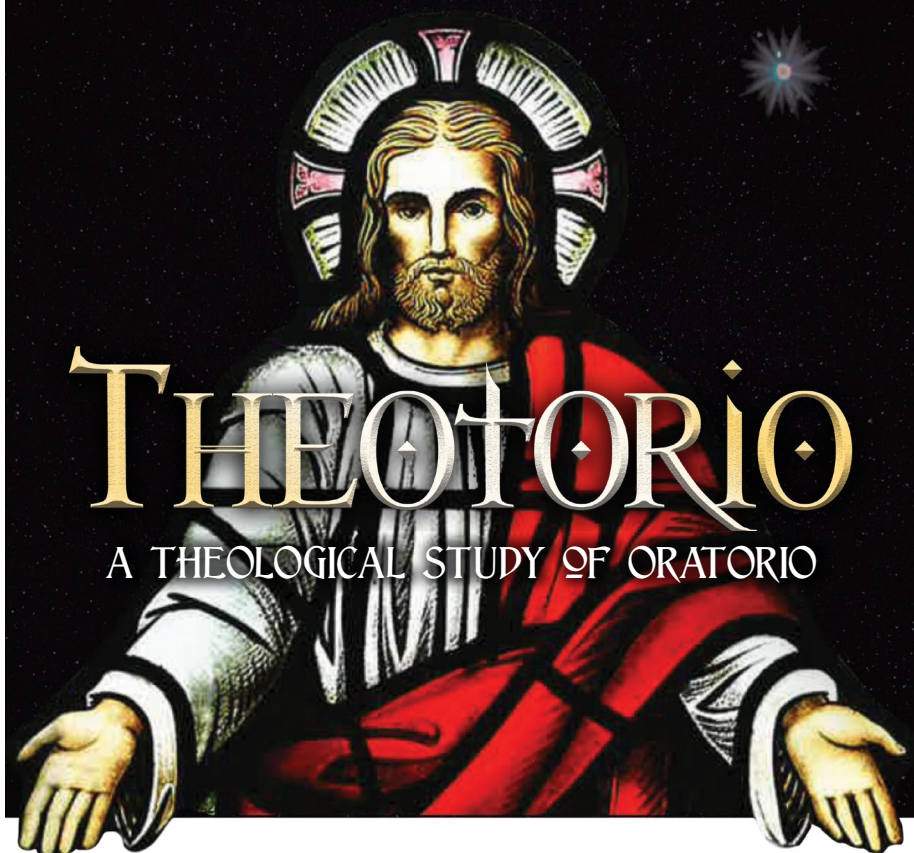
