

On November 11th, we pause to remember those whose lives were shaped or taken by war — the soldiers, civilians, and artists who bore witness to history's most turbulent moments. Benjamin Britten was one of those artists. In 1939, a year before the Blitz, Britten left England for America, fleeing both the threat of war and the constriction of his creative and personal freedoms. Yet even in exile, he turned again and again to the music of his homeland — the folk songs he grew up with, that echoed with love, loss, resilience, and memory. These arrangements offer more than music. They are songs of remembrance — not just for those who went to war, but for the land left behind, the homes disrupted, and the peace so longed for. Through these melodies, Britten reconnects with home, and we too are invited to reflect: on the cost of conflict, the ache of distance, and the quiet power of song to carry memory forward.








BOOK CLUB - MONDAY, NOVEMBER 24 | 7:00 PM
